



יְהוָה אֱלֹהֵינוּ = YAHOWAH ALOACHYACH, ELOACHYACH, This means YAHOWAH THE ALMIGHTY STRONG ONE OF THE FIRST CAUSE. It does not mean THE LORD, LORD, THE GOD, GOD, THE GAWD, THE GAD, THE GD, GD, THE GOD. It does not mean JEHOVAH, YAHOWAH, YEHOVEH, YAHWEH, YAHVEH.

אלהים = ALOACHYIM, ELOACHYIM, ELOAHYIM, ELOHIM. This is only mentioned twice in The Ten Commandments, which means THE ALMIGHTY ONES, MIGHTY ONES. It does not mean GAWD, THE GAWD, GAD, THE GAD, THE GD, GD, GOD, THE GOD. It does not mean THE LORD, LORD either.

אל = AL (EL) is only mentioned once, which means THE ALMIGHTY ONE OF THE FIRST CAUSE THE STRONG ONE.
